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CAN YOU SELL YOUR HOUSE IF YOU HAVE A REVERSE MORTGAGE? YES!



Kisha- Absolutely! A reverse mortgage is a type of loan for senior citizens aged 62 or older who may want money to pay off an existing mortgage, supplement their income, or pay for necessary expenses. It allows them to convert part of the equity in their home into cash. This can be very appealing with seniors on a fixed income.

SDM- The most common scenario I hear about reverse mortgages is that once the person who has the reverse mortgage dies the mortgage company automatically gets the house. Is that true?

Kisha- The mortgage does NOT automatically revert back to the lender. The mortgage must be repaid in the event the seller dies. This can be achieved by selling the home. The heirs of the seller have the legal right to sell the home to repay the mortgage, and in today's market they can repay the loan and walk away with a profit from the sale of the home.

SDM- I've also heard that if the person dies that has the

house, then their heirs will have to take on that debt. Any truth to that?

Kisha- The Estate of the seller becomes responsible for repaying the loan or letting the house go back to the lender. As stated above the estate can sell the home to repay the loan.

SDM- It has also been stated that if the homeowner owed taxes on the house, then the home couldn't be sold. Any truth to that?

Kisha- There is a two-part answer to your question. When a senior takes out a reverse mortgage; they are still responsible for the annual property taxes and maintenance of the home. If not budgeted correctly they can easily become delinquent on their property taxes and lose their home to a foreclosure tax sale. However, they can sell the home, and the taxes can be paid from the profit of the sale.

SDM- Well Kisha you've put a lot of rumors to rest! Our community can greatly benefit from your many years in the housing business as a realtor and expertise in this arena. Are there any other misconceptions that you want to clear up? Also, how can people reach you if they need your services?

Kisha- I want our community to be educated on the pros and cons of a reverse mortgage. It can be a very helpful monetary resource for seniors on a fixed income, but they must be properly educated first. I've seen many homes lost because of the misinformation out there. I'd be happy to answer any questions about how to avoid losing a home with a reverse mortgage. My contact number is 214-854-2424.



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
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WOMEN PAINTING WOMEN: A MUST SEE EXHIBITION

Women Painting Women, curated by Andrea Karnes at the Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth. The display of artistry is powerful, rollicking, muscular, full-throated, varied, meaningful, and inspiring, as the exhibition is full of women artists making paintings of women. Included in the exhibition are Njideka Akunyiii Crosby, María Berrío, Jordan Casteel, Nicole Eisenman, Tracy Emin, Alice Neel, Faith Ringold, Deborah Roberts, Susan Rothenberg, Dana Shutz, Amy Sherald, Lorna Simpson and many others. However, it isn't just the starry names that make the show, it's the fact that Karnes was able to procure excellent paintings from each of them. The vast majority of the show consists of loans, which shows the effort and intention behind assembling these works and exhibited precisely this way. It is a curatorial tour-de-force, and for current and aspiring curators, one of the best examples North Texas has had in years of the full impact a curator can have on a specific exhibition.

One has to start with Amy Sherald's A Midsummer Afternoon Dream (2020), for it is the piece that greets you at the top of the stairs of the Modern. For many years this spot was occupied by a green self-portrait of Andy Warhol, and to now see a black woman gazing relaxed and confident at the viewer is a real treat. Sherald's signature treatment of skin tone in shades of warm grays gives an almost surrealist quality to the piece, as the landscape walks you through a place where sunflowers are in full bloom. Though she doesn't cease to stop there, as pictured also is a white dog and a bouquet of flowers resting in the basket of a pale yellow bicycle, on a sunny blue clouded day giving a sense of Americana remixed and revisited. The blue dress, the brushwork, the colors, everything is intentional, and perfected, and gives a feeling of joy.

Both of María Berrío's pieces, Clouded Infinity (2020) and Wildflowers (2017) stood out in terms of their monumental scale and use of folded, painted paper for texture. Dana Schutz's Swimming, Smoking, Crying (2009) is a beautiful figurative almost manner-





ist-style head of a woman doing all the things in the title simultaneously. Everything Schulz does with the water, face, eyes, and cigarette is top tier. Similarly, Nicole Eisenman's Close to the Edge (2015) is another masterclass in painting. The details within the brown paints, the scratchwork to get the light, and the translucence of the curtains on the window, all accentuates the realism of the photo. The lighter and the clock on the window sill, and the compositional effect of abstraction, like a Mondrian grid, it's relentless.

Jordan Casteel's Pretty in Pink (2019) shows a black woman sitting in a subway car in her pink coat and pink backpack with a heart on it, gazing with pink eye shadow and lipstick at her phone that too is pink. Casteel's ability to depict a moment in an almost gestural way, but still lovingly detailed, makes her one of the best painters of the millennial generation. There

are so many other highlights, and if there is one thing to be aware of is that nude forms and sexuality are also addressed in this show in wonderful and loving ways.

So, I urge you to see this outstanding exhibition at the Modern. I know that I can't wait to revisit and learn more from these beautiful artists and paintings, and this time, I will be bringing my friends!.

THE TRUTH ABOUT MONKEYPOX



Monkey Pox haspit the Dallas area at an alarming rate and here are some frequently asked questions that you should know and how to protect yourself and your loved ones.

Frequently Ask Questions

What Is Monkeypox?

Monkeypox is a rare disease caused by infection with the monkeypox virus. Monkeypox virus is part of the same family of viruses as smallpox. Monkeypox symptoms are similar to smallpox symptoms, but milder, and monkeypox is rarely fatal.

Is It Deadly?

The strain in this outbreak is rarely fatal. Over 99% of people who get this form of the disease are likely to survive. Certain people have risk for serious illness- weakened immune systems, children under 8 years of age, people with a history of eczema, and people who are pregnant or breastfeeding.

Although the West African strain is rarely fatal, symptoms can be extremely painful, and people might have permanent scarring resulting from the rash.

Am I likely to get monkeypox?

At this time, the risk of monkeypox in the United States is believed to be low. Monkeypox does not spread easily between people, and the time between exposure and when symptoms start gives health officials more time to track down contacts and break the chain of infection. People who do not have monkeypox symptoms cannot spread the virus to others.

How is it spread?

Monkeypox spreads in different ways. The virus can spread from person-to-person through direct contact with the infectious rash, scabs, or body fluids. It also can be spread by respiratory secretions during prolonged, face-to-face contact, or during intimate physical contact, such as kissing, cuddling, or sex. In addition, pregnant people can spread the virus to their fetus through the placenta.

Touching items (such as clothing or linens) that previously touched the infectious rash or body fluids is another way monkeypox spreads. It's also possible for people to get monkeypox from infected animals, either by being scratched or bitten by the animal or by eating meat or using products from an infected animal.

People who do not have monkeypox symptoms cannot spread the virus to others.

Monkeypox can spread from the time symptoms start until the rash has fully healed and a fresh layer of skin has formed. The illness typically lasts 2-4 weeks.

Can I get Monkeypox from having Sex?

Even though it is not considered a sexually transmitted infection, monkeypox can spread during intimate physical contact between people. This contact can happen when you have sex, including:

• Oral, anal, and vaginal sex, or touching the genitals or anus of a person with monkeypox

Hugging, massage, kissing or talking closely

• Touching fabrics, shared surfaces, and objects, such as bedding, towels and sex toys, that were used by a person with monkeypox

Anyone can get monkeypox if they have close contact with someone who has the virus.

What Treatments Area Available?

There are no treatments specifically for monkeypox virus infections. However, monkeypox and smallpox viruses are genetically similar, which means that antiviral drugs and vaccines developed to protect against smallpox may be used to treat and prevent monkeypox virus infections.

Antivirals, such as tecovirimat (TPOXX), may be recommended for people who are more likely to get severely ill, like patients with weakened immune systems.

The U.S. government has two stockpiled vaccines—JYNNEOS and ACAM2000—that can prevent monkeypox in people who have been exposed to the virus. Vaccines may be recommended for people who have had contact with someone who has monkeypox, or for healthcare and public health workers who may have been

exposed to the virus.

Do I need to get Vaccinated against Monkeypox?

CDC does not recommend widespread vaccination against monkeypox at this time. However, vaccination may be recommended for some people who:

- Are close personal contacts of people with monkeypox
- May have been exposed to the virus.

• May have increased risk of being exposed to the virus, such as people who perform laboratory testing to diagnose monkeypox.

Could my Pet Get Monkeypox?

Monkeypox can spread between animals and people. However, CDC does not currently believe that monkeypox poses a high risk to pets.

During the 2003 monkeypox outbreak in the United States, we did not see disease spread to domestic animals other than prairie dogs, and we do not have reason to believe that we will see that now. However, we still recommend that people with monkeypox avoid interacting with animals and find someone else to take care of their pets while they recover.

What are The Symptoms?

Symptoms of monkeypox can include:

- Fever
- Headache

- Muscle aches and backache
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Chills
- Exhaustion

• A rash that can look like pimples or blisters that appears on the face, inside the mouth, and on other parts of the body, like the hands, feet, chest, genitals, or anus.

o The rash goes through different stages before healing completely. The illness typically lasts 2-4 weeks. Sometimes, people get a rash first, followed by other symptoms. Others only experience a rash.

What Should I do if I have Symptoms?

• See a healthcare provider if you notice a new or unexplained rash or other monkeypox symptoms.

• Remind the healthcare provider that monkeypox is circulating.

• Avoid close contact (including intimate physical contact) with others until a healthcare provider examines you.

• Avoid close contact with pets or other animals until a healthcare provider examines you.

• If you're waiting for test results, follow the same precautions.

• If your test is positive, stay isolated until your rash has healed, all scabs have fallen off, and a fresh layer of intact skin has formed

START THE SCHOOL YEAR WITH AN A+ IN LUNCH

Most students return to school in August, backpacks full and often lunch bags dangling from their hands. Somehow, it seems natural that August is National Sandwich Month, with sandwiches a brown-bag staple. It's also Kids Eat Right MonthTM -- when the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics highlights "smart shopping, healthy eating and active lifestyles for every age group from infant to teens."

Balanced, nutritious meals power students through a day of learning and after-school activities.

When children skip lunch, they may have difficulty paying attention during afternoon classes, then turn to low-nutrient snacks after school, and miss out on key nutrients such as calcium, vitamin D, iron, zinc, and fiber.

So, here's how to get going and keep it going throughout the school year.

HOW TO MAKE IT WORK

Get your kids involved in planning, preparing, and packing their lunches. Let kids pick from a parent-approved list of foods to add to the grocery cart. At home, schedule time to prep. Let kids help wash, chop, and package veggies and fruits for the week. Children are more likely to try new foods and eat their lunches when they participate in preparing them.

WHAT TO INCLUDE

Starting with fruits and vegetables is a smart move. According to the Centers for Disease Control, most children still do not eat the recommended number of fruits and veggie servings daily. Naturally rich in vitamins, minerals, antioxidants, fiber, and other phytonutrients, veggies and fruit in adequate amounts help kids stay on track in growth milestones and prepare their brains and bodies for the rigors of life. Here's a good equation to start with:

2+1+1+1 = a balanced meal

2 vegetables servings 1 fruit 1 protein 1 whole grain

Choose a rainbow of vegetables and opt for whole fruits over fruit juices. Mix up protein options -- meats, beans, nuts, eggs, and tofu. Whole grains include 100% whole wheat bread, whole-grain wraps or crackers, brown rice, wild rice, oatmeal, teff, popcorn, barley, and quinoa.

KEEP IT INTERESTING

Sandwiches are the ultimate convenience food but also an ideal vehicle to pack in quality nutrients by adding lettuce, spinach, tomatoes, or grilled or roasted vegetables.

Play around with sandwiches. Look beyond the tradition PBJ and even 2 slices + filling equation to solve lunch dilemmas. Use a whole grain tortilla or wrap, spread with refried beans or hummus, add fresh vegetables such as spinach, tomatoes, shredded carrots, shredded zucchini, and sliced bell pepper.

Or opt for cubes of ham or turkey with cubes of leftover combread or whole grain crackers instead of a sandwich. Include other finger foods such as sliced bell peppers, cherry tomatoes, carrots, broccoli, or cauliflower florets with dip.

Celebrate special days such as birthdays or a holiday or a just because day by including a special treat.

Kids, like adults, eat with their eyes first, so go for the color and cut fruits and vegetables and sandwiches into fun shapes; younger children can help with this using cookie cutters.

Preparing balanced lunches to take to school is part of setting up kids for a lifetime of healthful eating. And a full stomach from a healthy lunch will help power them through a productive afternoon in class.

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


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
